Public Toilet Stakeholders,

CODE OF PRACTICE ON ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH (COPEH) 2021 – REQUIREMENT ON WASH HAND BASINS

Please be reminded that the National Environment Agency (NEA) has updated the requirement on wash hand basins and taps under Section 2 of the <u>COPEH</u>. The requirement on wash hand basins and taps have evolved over time due to operational considerations and feedback received.

2 For ease of reference, an extract of COPEH 2021 has been appended below. Do take note that **flat-bottomed wash hand basins should not be installed at public toilets.**

3 Flat-bottomed wash hand basin may lead to poor cleanliness standards and maintenance due to the design of the wash hand basin which traps dirt and food remnants. Therefore, we encourage the adoption of well-designed sanitary fittings, which facilitates the cleaning and maintenance of the toilet and nudge good toilet behaviour from users at the same time.
