

Smoking Prohibition

For Individuals

Places and Vehicles where Smoking is Prohibited

Smoking is prohibited in the majority of indoor locations and selected outdoor locations in Singapore—including cinemas, shopping malls and offices, bus interchanges and shelters, swimming pools, sports stadia, etc. Designated smoking areas are allowed in certain premises such as food retail establishments and entertainment outlets. Smoking is also prohibited in most public service vehicles such as private bus, school bus, taxis and private-hire cars on paid chauffeured service.

Penalties for Violations by Smokers

An individual who is caught smoking in a prohibited place is liable to a composition of \$200. If convicted in Court, the offender may be liable to a fine of up to \$1,000.

Reporting Violations

It is the responsibility of the management and operators of public service vehicles to deal with smokers who violate the smoking prohibition, including asking the smokers to stop smoking or leave the premises or vehicles.

Members of the public should report violations to the management, whenever possible, for them to deal with. In public places where there is no specific managing agent to deal with violators, the public can contact the NEA at 1800-CALL-NEA (1800-2255 632) to file a report.
