FACT SHEET: ONEMILLIONTREES MOVEMENT

The OneMillionTrees movement is a key component of efforts to further extend nature into our urban landscape as we transform into a City in Nature. It aims to redouble Singapore's efforts to green its urban infrastructure on an unprecedented scale, to achieve the vision of making Singapore a City in Nature. As the lead agency for greenery in Singapore, NParks will work with the community to carry out the OneMillionTrees movement to plant one million more trees across Singapore with the community by 2030. This will take place throughout the island, including streetscapes, gardens, parks and park connectors, nature reserves and nature parks.

To date, we have planted over 270,000 trees. Together with the community, we have planted trees along our streetscapes, on Jurong Island, and within our nature reserves, gardens and parks, including Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve, Jurong Lake Gardens, Pulau Ubin, Pasir Ris Park and Telok Blangah Hill Park.

Corporations and other organisations have made commitments to contribute to the movement via the Plant-A-Tree programme through NParks' registered charity and IPC, the Garden City Fund (GCF). Keppel Corporation has pledged to donate \$3 million for some 10,000 trees to be planted over the next five years in Singapore's parks and nature reserves. In April this year, AIA Singapore pledged \$5 million for 16,666 trees to be planted over the next five years as well. This is the single largest donation pledged to the OneMillionTrees movement and GCF's Plant-A-Tree programme to date. In addition, organisations like Fairprice Group, OCBC, Raffles Institution, Shimizu and their contractors, UPS, and many others have also committed to come on board to support this movement. JTC has also garnered support from over 70 companies and organisations on Jurong Island to intensify greenery on the island.
